




McKinleyville Community Services District

- The McKinleyville Community Services District is an independent special district established in 1970 by a vote of the people.
- Initially, the District had authority to serve water and treat sewer wastes. In 1972, the voters added street lighting powers, in 1985 recreational powers and in 1995 library powers, which allowed for the construction of the McKinleyville Library.
- Today, the District serves 17,000 people, providing water, wastewater, parks and recreation, library, streetlights, and open space maintenance services to residents and businesses in the unincorporated area of McKinleyville.



MCKINLEYVILLE COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT FORMATION TIMELINE






Measure B

- Measure B was originally passed by voters 30 years ago, in 1993, and is a local assessment to help fund McKinleyville services.
- Measure B originally funded construction and maintenance of Azalea Hall at Pierson Park, McKinleyville Activity Center at Pierson Park, and Hiller Sports Complex.





McKinleyville Sheriff Substation

- In 1999, the Mad River Rotary Club completed the fund-raising and construction of a Law Enforcement Facility on District land adjacent to the Library and Azalea Hall.
- The facility was then donated to the District and is leased to the Humboldt County Sheriff's Department.



What's the issue?

Rising inflation has severely impacted our ability to adequately maintain the local services our community expects and deserves. Unless additional local funding is identified:

- The local Sheriff's office may be closed, forcing deputies based in Eureka to come and service McKinleyville.
- We risk being unable to maintain trails, close bathrooms, and reduce trash collection, which could lead to large volumes of uncollected trash.
- We will have to dramatically reduce all landscape maintenance and playfields will not be watered or mowed.





Community Priorities

(As identified in a recent local survey)

- Keeping the McKinleyville Sheriff's Office open
- Keeping park restrooms open and clean, maintaining and improving safety lighting, playfields and playgrounds in Pierson Park and all parks
- Keeping the Senior Center and Library open, and maintaining Azalea Hall
- Maintaining the Teen Center that gives kids a safe place to go after school
- Keeping open space and trails open/maintained




